In a relief to millers, the Centre has enhanced the paddy acceptance target for Haryana to 59.62 lakh metric tonnes (LMT) from 55 lakh MT for last procurement season (KMS 2025-26-kharif). Besides, the government has also extended the date for the delivery of custom-milled rice (CMR) against the enhanced estimate up to September 30, 2026.

The approval has been conveyed by the Ministry of Consumer Affairs, Food and Public Distribution in an order issued on Thursday. The decision came after examining procurement trends over the last two seasons, the allocation of rice for delivery under the Improved Rice Scheme, physical verification of unmilled stocks and relat-

her fixed a target of 55 lakh MT for paddy acceptance by the FCI, while around 62 lakh MT was procured by government agencies and allotted to nearly 1,400 millers across the state.

CMR delivery deadline was June 30, 2026, and later it was extended to September 30 by the Centre, but the FCI had restricted its officials not to accept further delivery of CMR, after which the millers started protests.

The Union government has, however, attached some conditions to the approval. The Haryana Government has been asked to ensure adequate checks and safeguards to prevent irregular procurement, rationalise the methodology for yield fixa-

tion in procurement operations by the next rabi marketing season to strengthen the validation of farmer and land records and improve the integrity of the procurement process.

Amarjit Chhabra, state president, Haryana Pradesh Rice Millers and Dealers Association, said that the approval was the result of nearly two months of efforts by the association, the state government and the department.

Jewel Singla, state president of Haryana Rice Millers and Dealers Association, requested the government to enhance the paddy acceptance target to around 62 lakh MT, so that the whole rice against the whole procured paddy could be delivered to the FCI.

Saini disburses over ₹1,890 crore to more than 50L beneficiaries

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 10 Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini on Thursday released Rs 1,890.16 crore directly into the bank accounts of 50.28 lakh eligible beneficiaries under 26 different schemes.

These include the instalment under the Deen Dayal Lado Lakshmi Yojana, social security pensions for the elderly and persons with disabilities, financial assistance to needy families under the DAYALU Yojana, gas subsidy for homemakers, Bhavantar compensation for farmers, and incentives to entrepreneurs under various schemes of the Industries and Commerce Department.

The Chief Minister said the double-engine government is committed to ensuring the benefits of government schemes

reach every eligible person directly, transparently and in a time-bound manner.

Addressing a press conference on Thursday, he said the 11th instalment of the 'Deen Dayal Lado Lakshmi' Yojana has been released today. Under the scheme, Rs 212.16 crore has been credited to the bank accounts of 10.10 lakh women beneficiaries. With this, a total amount of Rs 2,254.47 crore has been released under the scheme in 11 instalments so far.

State gurdwara panel seeks hike in pilgrim quota for Pak

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 10 The overwhelming response from devotees to celebrate the 'parkash purb' of Guru Nanak at Sri Nanakana Sahib in Pakistan has compelled Sikh bodies to urge the governments of India and Pakistan to increase the 'pilgrim protocol' limit.

The jatha is scheduled to cross over to Pakistan on November 22 and return on December 1 after paying obeisance at several Sikh shrines. As per the quota allocated

by the Union Home Ministry, the SGPC has to its credit the largest share of sending jatha — 1,800 pilgrims — followed by the Delhi Sikh Gurdwara Management Committee (DSGMC) with approved quota of 555 devotees. The Haryana Sikh Gurdwara Management Committee (HSGMC) can send a maximum of 200 devotees.

The HSGMC has approached the ministry seeking a quota of 700 pilgrims. HSGMC president Jagdish Singh Jhinda said a letter dated September 8,

2026, has been sent to Home Minister Amit Shah. At least 600 applications have already been received, he said, adding that "it is a herculean task to pick and drop applications. On what ground do we accept or reject an application?"

"We have requested that 700-pilgrim quota be given each on the occasion of Guru Nanak's birth anniversary and Baisakhi celebrations in Pakistan, in addition to at least 80 for the death anniversary of Maharaja Ranjit Singh and 100 for the martyrdom day of Guru Arjan Dev," he said.

CM reviews progress of 11 projects

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 10 Chief Minister Nayab Singh Saini directed the construction work of the Integrated Manufacturing Cluster (IMC) near the airport in Hisar be expedited. He said the development of the IMC would boost economic activities in the entire region.

The CM issued these directions while chairing a review meeting on various development projects costing more than Rs 75 crore being implemented in the state under the 'State Pragati Portal' on Thursday. During the meeting, he reviewed the progress of 11 development projects.

State to hold roll revision campaign

CHANDIGARH, SEPTEMBER 10 A Sreenivas, state Chief Electoral Officer, said under the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) being conducted by the Election Commission of India, a special campaign will be organised on September 12-13 and September 26-27 for the

convenience of voters. On these dates, all Booth Level Officers across the state will remain present at their respective polling stations from 9 am to 5 pm to receive claims and objections from eligible voters.

Sreenivas appealed to citi-

zens to check the draft electoral roll and ensure that their names, as well as those of eligible members of their families, are included. If the name of an eligible person is not included in the electoral roll, a claim for inclusion can be submitted through Form-6 along with the

required documents and declaration. So far, a total of 1,71,233 applications of Form-6 have been received. For correction of name, address, age, photograph or other particulars in the electoral roll, Form-8 can be submitted along with the required documents. — TNS
